Unity

Unity is the relationship among the elements of a visual that helps all the elements function together.


Unity gives a sense of oneness and <u>cohesiveness</u> to a design. When a composition has unity, the design will be viewed as one piece, as a whole, and not as separate elements with the work of art.

It is what pulls the Elements of Art together.


Unity **helps organize a visual image**, facilitating interpretation and understanding. **Unity helps create order**.

You know unity has been achieved when all aspects of the design complement one another rather than compete for attention.


It serves to **reinforce the relationship** between the design elements and relates them to the key theme being expressed in a work of art.




Unity can be achieved through the <u>use of similar shapes</u>.
